Land Acknowledgement

All Saints' Peterborough resides on the sacred land of the Michi Saagiig Anishinaabeg, the first peoples of this land. We offer our respect to those ancestors who may be buried in this land. This sacred land is part of the Rice Lake Purchase, Treaty 20. All Saints' is committed to continued reconciliation with our Indigenous siblings, through continued education and the inclusion of readings from the First Nations Bible.

Liturgical Notes

- In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews (also called Israelites) of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in God as the ancient peoples of God.
- 2. Younger and Elder Testament. The traditional terms for the testaments 'Old' and 'New' have been changed to Elder and Younger. This has been done as an act of equity and promise. Old and New are words in our society that add value to things often anything that is old is considered less valuable than things that are new. In our Christian context the New Testament has replaced the Old Testament, which is not only an incorrect theology, but it has also tied to it ethnic value, and antisemitic tones. The words Elder and Younger are born out of equity, and the Younger Testament is born out of the Elder Testament.

Reading

Isaiah 2:1-5, Inclusive Bible

A reading from the Elder Testament and the book of the Prophet Isaiah. This is what Isaiah ben-Amos saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem: In the last days, the mountain of God's Temple will be established as the most important mountain and raised above all other hills—all nations will stream toward it. Many people will come and say: "Come, let us climb God's mountain to the Temple of the God of Jacob, that we may be instructed in God's ways and walk in God's paths."

Instruction will be given from Zion and the word of God from Jerusalem. God will judge between nations and render decisions for many countries. They will beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation will not raise the sword against another, and never again will they train for war.

Prayer The following is a prayer written by Walter Breuggemann on the occasion of the bombing of Serbia in March of 1999.
It was inspired by the passage we just heard.
Let us pray,
And now their plowshares are beat into swords—as are ours, now their pruning hooks are beat into spears—as are ours.
Not only swords and spears, but bullets, and bombs, and missiles,

of steel on flesh, of power against bodies ...

And you, in your indignation sound your mantra,

"Blessed are the peacemakers."

We dare to believe they are the aggressor, and we are the peacemaker. Yet in sober night dream, we glance otherwise and think we may be aggressor, as we vision rubbled homes, murdered civilians, and charred babies. And you, in our sadness, sound your mantra,

"Blessed are the peacemakers."

We do not love war, we yearn for peace, but we have lost much will for peace even while we dream of order.

And you, in your hope, sound your mantra,

"Blessed are the peacemakers."

Deliver us from excessive certitude about ourselves.

Hold us in the deep ambiguity where we find ourselves,

Show us yet again the gaping space between your will and our feeble imagination. Sound your mantra with more authority, with more indignation, through sadness, in hope ...

"Blessed be the peacemakers."

Only peacemakers are blessed. We find ourselves well short of blessed. Give us freedom for your deep otherwise, finally to be blessed, in the name of the Peacemaker who gave and did not take.

Psalm 46

Inclusive Bible

Psalm 46 – is a communal hymn confessing confidence and trust in God as a sure refuge in times of trouble. Fear has no hold on those who heed. The instruction, *Be still, and know that I am God*. I invite you to read the psalm with me.

God is our refuge and our strength, Who from old has helped us in our distress. Therefore, we fear nothing—even if the earth should open up in front of us and mountains plunge into the depths of the sea, even if earth's waters rage and foam and the mountains tumble with its heaving.

There is a river whose streams gladden the city of God,

the holt dwelling of the Most High. God is in its midst, it will never fall—God will help it at daybreak. Though nations are in turmoil and empires crumble, God's voice resounds, and it melts the earth.

The God of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

Come, see what God has done—God makes the earth bounteous! God has put and end to war, from one end of the earth to the other, Breaking bows, splintering spears, and setting chariots on fire.

Colossians 3:12-17, Inclusive Bible

A reading from the younger Testament and the record of the Colossians. Because you are God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with heartfelt compassion, with kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with one another; forgive whatever grievances you have against one another—forgive in the same way God has forgiven you. Above all else, put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them perfect. Let Christ's peace reign in your hearts since, as members of one body, you have been called to that peace. Dedicate yourselves to thankfulness. Let the Word of Christ, rich as it is, dwell in you. Instruct and admonish one another wisely. Sing gratefully to God from your hearts in psalms, hymns and songs of the Spirit. And whatever you do, whether in speech or in action, do it in the name of Jesus our Saviour, giving thanks to God through Christ.
