Land Acknowledgement

All Saints' Peterborough resides on the sacred land of the Michi Saagiig Anishinaabeg, the first peoples of this land. We offer our respect to those ancestors who may be buried in this land. This sacred land is part of the Rice Lake Purchase, Treaty 20. All Saints' is committed to continued reconciliation with our Indigenous siblings, through continued education and the inclusion of readings from the First Nations Bible.

Liturgical Notes

- In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews (also called Israelites) of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in God as the ancient peoples of God.
- 2. Younger and Elder Testament. The traditional terms for the testaments 'Old' and 'New' have been changed to Elder and Younger. This has been done as an act of equity and promise. Old and New are words in our society that add value to things often anything that is old is considered less valuable than things that are new. In our Christian context the New Testament has replaced the Old Testament, which is not only an incorrect theology, but it has also tied to it ethnic value, and antisemitic tones. The words Elder and Younger are born out of equity, and the Younger Testament is born out of the Elder Testament.

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

Reading

2 Samuel 6:1-5, 12b-19, NRSV

Reading from the Elder Testament and the 2nd book of Samuel. David again gathered all the chosen men of Israel, thirty-thousand. David and all the people with him set out and went from Baale-Judah, to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of the God of hosts who is enthroned on the cherubim. They carried the ark of God on a new cart, and brought it out of the house of Abinadab, which was on the hill. Uzziah and Ahio, the sons of Abinadab, were driving the new cart with the ark of God; and Ahio went in front of the ark. David and all the house of Israel were dancing before God with all their might, with songs and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals.

So, David went and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obededom to the city of David with rejoicing; and when those who bore the ark of God had gone six paces, David sacrificed an ox and a fatling. David danced before God with all his might; David was girded with a linen ephod. So, David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of God with shouting, and with the sound of the trumpet. As the ark of God came into the city of David, Michal daughter of Saul looked out of the window, and saw King David leaping and dancing before God; and she despised him in her heart. They brought in the ark of God, and set it in its place, inside the tent that David had pitched for it; and David offered burnt offerings and offerings of well-being before God. When David had finished offering the burnt offerings and the offerings of well-being, David blessed the people in the name of the God of hosts, and distributed food among all the people, the whole multitude of Israel, every person, to each a cake of bread, a portion of meat, and a cake of raisins. Then all the people went back to their homes.

A reading from the Younger Testament and Paul's letter to the Church in Ephesus.

Blessed be the God and Creator of our Saviour Jesus the Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as Christ was chosen before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before God in love.

God destined us for adoption as children through Jesus the Christ, according to the good pleasure of God's will, to the praise of God's glorious grace that is freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In Christ we have redemption through Christ's blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of Christ's grace that is lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight, it has been made known to us the mystery of God's will, according to God's good pleasure that is set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth.

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of Christ who accomplishes all things according to counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of Christ's glory. In Christ you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in Christ, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of God's glory.

Meanwhile Herod, the ruler of Judea, had heard about Jesus, whose reputation had become widespread. Some people were saying, "John the Baptizer has been raised from the dead, and that is why such miraculous powers are at work in Jesus." Others said, "He is Elijah"; still others, "he is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." When Herod heard of Jesus he exclaimed, "John, whom I beheaded, has risen from the dead!" Now it was Herod who had ordered John arrested, chained and imprisoned on account of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip, whom Herod had married. As for Herodias, she was furious with John and wanted to kill him but was unable to do so. Herod feared John, knowing him to be good and holy, and kept him in custody. When Herod heard John speak, he was very much disturbed; yet he was moved by John's words. Herodias had her chance one day when Herod on his birthday held a dinner for the court circle, military officers and leaders of Galilee.

When the daughter of Herodias came in and danced, this delighted Herod and the guest so much that he told the young woman, "ask me anything you like and I will give it to you." And Herod swore and oath, "I will give you anything you ask, even half of my entire realm!" She went out and said to her mother, "What should I ask for?" Herodias replied, "The head of John the Baptizer." The woman hurried back to Herod and made her request: "I want you to give me the head of John the Baptizer on a platter."
