Land Acknowledgement

All Saints' Peterborough resides on the sacred land of the Michi Saagiig Anishinaabeg, the first peoples of this land. We offer our respect to those ancestors who may be buried in this land. This sacred land is part of the Rice Lake Purchase, Treaty 20. All Saints' is committed to continued reconciliation with our Indigenous siblings, through continued education and the inclusion of readings from the First Nations Bible.

Liturgical Notes

- 1. In the context of Christian Liturgy, Israel does not refer to the current political state, but either to the historic Hebrews (also called Israelites) of the ancient Near East or, in Christian theology, to all people who put their faith and trust in God as the ancient peoples of God.
- 2. Younger and Elder Testament. The traditional terms for the testaments 'Old' and 'New' have been changed to Elder and Younger. This has been done as an act of equity and promise. Old and New are words in our society that add value to things often anything that is old is considered less valuable than things that are new. In our Christian context the New Testament has replaced the Old Testament, which is not only an incorrect theology, but it has also tied to it ethnic value, and antisemitic tones. The words Elder and Younger are born out of equity, and the Younger Testament is born out of the Elder Testament.

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD Reading

2 Samuel 7:1-14, NRSV

Reading from the Elder Testament and the 2nd book of Samuel. Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Eternal God had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Eternal God is with you."

But that same night the word of the Eternal God came to Nathan: Go and tell my servant David: Thus says God: "Are you the one to build me a house to live in? I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?"

Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the God of hosts: "I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make

for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies.

Moreover, it is declared to you that God will make you a house. When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me."

Psalm 89:20-37 SSJD

Psalm 89 contains almost all of the breath of the psalm's genres. From a royal lament, to praise and a poetic version of the covenant with David. Praise of God for choosing David, and the common refrain of the Doxology to close the psalm. Blessed be God forever, Amen. I invite you to read the selected verses with me.

I have found David my servant; with my holy oil have I anointed him. My hand will hold him fast and my arm will make him strong. No enemy shall deceive him, nor shall the wicked bring him down. I will crush his foes before him and strike down those who hate him. My faithfulness and love shall be with him, and he shall be victorious through my name. I shall make his dominion extend from the great sea to the river. David will say to me, "You gave me life, my God, you are my rock of my salvation. I will make him my firstborn and higher than the kings of the earth. I will keep my love for him forever, and my covenant will stand for him. I will establish his line forever and his throne as the days of heaven. If his children forsake my law and do not walk according to my judgements; if they break my statutes and do not keep my commandments; I will punish their transgressions with a rod and their iniquities with a lash; But I will not take my love from

David, nor let my faithfulness prove false. I will not break my covenant, nor change what has gone out of my lips. Once for all I have sworn by my holiness: 'I will not lie to David. His line shall endure for ever and his throne as the sun before me; it shall stand fast forevermore like the moon, the abiding witness in the sky.'

Reading

Ephesians 2:1-22, NRSV

A reading from the Younger Testament and Paul's letter to the Church in Ephesus.

Bear in mind that at one time the men among you who were Gentiles physically – called "the uncircumcised" by those who call themselves "the circumcised," all because of a minor operation had no part in Christ and were excluded from the community of Israel.

You were strangers to the covenant and its promise; you were without hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus, you who were once far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For Christ is our peace, who made both groups into one and broke down the barrier of hostility that kept us apart.

In his own flesh, Christ abolished the law, with its commands and ordinances, in order to make the two into one new person, this establishing peace and reconciling us all to God in one body through the cross, which put to death the enmity between us. Christ came and "announced the Good news of peace to you who were far away, and to those who were near"; for through Christ, we all have access in one Spirit to God. This means that you are strangers and aliens no longer. No, you are included in God's holy people and are members of the household of God, which is built on the foundation of the apostles and the prophets, with Christ Jesus as the capstone. In Christ you are being built into this temple, to become a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.
